Common Errors in Creating Conceptual ERDs

- 1. Forgetting to include all of the entity types needed to accomplish the scope identified for the system.
- 2. Placing attributes on the wrong entity type.
- 3. Placing the same attribute on more than one entity type (except for foreign keys).
- 4. Forgetting to mark the attributes that comprise the identifier (PK) for each entity type.
- 5. Forgetting to include all relationships needed to accomplish the scope.
- 6. Forgetting to name each relationship (except for those on associative entities).
- 7. Forgetting to indicate the cardinality of each relationship (at both ends).
- 8. Confusing which cardinality is expressed at which end of the relationship line.
- 9. Missing data that is needed to implement a relationship (like quantity of items).
- 10. Forgetting to create associative entities to hold data elements needed to implement a relationship (like OrderLine).
- 11. Creating entity types to store the results of reports or queries. These results are typically not stored. The report or query is simply executed whenever needed.
