# INFOST 490 - Senior Capstone Instructions for System Demo Presentation

## **Assignment**

The form of the system demo presentation depends upon whether you are part of an on-campus section or an online section. Groups that are part of an on-campus section will make their presentation in person during the last week of classes. Groups that are part of an online section will create a video presentation that will be submitted to a D2L dropbox.

## Length

Due to class time considerations, on-campus presentations will be limited to 15 minutes. Online video demos will be limited to 30 minutes. On-campus or online groups that need more time to demonstrate the delivered system for the instructor can schedule additional sessions with the instructor either in-person or online (using the GoToMeeting platform.

## **Topics**

- 1. Demonstrate the system.
  - This includes a full demonstration of system functions that would be appropriate for project stakeholders.
- 2. Show documentation.
  - Show any system or user documentation that has been created for the system. This includes help screens, tutorial demos, manuals, etc.
- 3. Show the code.
  - Show the code that was used to implement the system. This includes HTML, CSS, PHP, Java, Python, SQL, or any other code that contributes to the system.

#### **Participants**

Your presentation should be made by two or more members of your team. You are free to include as many team members as you wish. Please be aware that switching presenters in an on-campus presentation may use up some of your time budget.

#### Slides

Your presentation should include a very brief slide show that reminds the audience of the particulars of your project.

## **Show and Tell**

The remainder of your presentation will take the form of show-and-tell. This will include demonstrating system functions, showing documentation, and showing code.

# **Tools and File Format for Online Sections**

You may use whatever tools you are familiar with to create the video presentation. I typically use Camtasia. Camtasia is available through the SOIS virtual lab. Whichever tool you choose, the delivered file should be in the .mp4 format.

# **File Naming Conventions for Online Sections**

The name of the file that you submit should include both your team name and the name of the assignment. It should follow the form:

team\_everest\_demo\_presentation.mp4

# **Due By**

Teams in on-campus sections will present during the last week of classes. Teams in online sections should submit by the date shown in the Weekly Schedule for that section.
