# LIS590MG – Project Management Instructions for Site Demo Video

## Assignment

Your group is expected to create and submit video demo presentation regarding your project. I will be using the content available in this presentation while grading the Delivered Site.

## Number and Length of Video Files

Submit one video that is up to 30 minutes in length. Shorter videos will be viewed and graded. Videos longer than 30 minutes will not be graded.

Your video may be edited such that it is composed of more than one recording. But, I expect to play only one video file while grading this submission. Please, do not submit multiple videos.

## **Submission Method**

A Moodle submission activity will be provided for the submission. Your team is expected to submit only the URL for their video. This means that your team will need to load your video onto a streaming service like YouTube before submission. Which video streaming service you choose does not matter. But, the URL submitted must play the video in a standard browser running on Windows 10 or macOS.

## Tools

I am still researching the best tool to use when recording video presentations at the Illinois iSchool. I expect to make an announcement and to update this section soon. Meanwhile, you are free to use whatever video recording tools you wish.

#### Video Content

Since this video will be used to grade the Delivered Site, it should demonstrate that the expectations for the Delivered Site were met. The following is a list of the expectations for the delivered site and a few ideas about how to demonstrate on the video that these expectations were met:

- 1. Functionality
  - Demonstrate the site as though you were showing it to the users.
  - Pay particular attention to what jobs can be accomplished using the features. This might be done by demonstrating how each user story is accomplished using the site.

# 2. Testing

- Describe the tools and methods that the team used to test the site.
- Describe any testing assets that will be available for use by the maintainers of the site.

- 3. Documentation
  - Show any documentation that the team has created for the users and the maintainers of the site.
  - Explain how this level of documentation is appropriate based on Agile project management principles.
- 4. Training
  - Show any training that the team has created for the users and the maintainers of the site.
  - Explain how this level of training is appropriate based on Agile project management principles.
- 5. Implementation
  - When showing content, documentation, training or any other deliverables, be sure to point out how they were created using best practices as taught at the Illinois iSchool.

## Participants

Your presentation should be made by two or more members of your team. You are free to include as many team members as you wish. Many teams include all members.

Submit one PDF document that contains your team name and the URL for the video. Name your PDF file using the following guide:
